

Bus Shelter Policy

1) Introduction

Pevensey Parish Council is empowered under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1953 to provide and maintain shelters on roads and land adjoining roads in the council area.

The council owns a combination of brick, cantilever, wooden and concrete bus shelters.

2) Policy Objectives

- a) To set out clearly the role and objections of the parish council towards provisions of the bus shelters.
- b) To ensure that that council investments relating to bus shelters are focused on providing value for money.

3) Service Provision for the bus shelters

- a) In view of the considerable capital outlay and ongoing maintenance costs it's the policy of Pevensey Parish Council not to erect any bus shelters at stops that do not currently have a shelter in place.
- b) The council is responsible for maintaining the existing shelters.
 - Monthly scheduled cleans and quarterly deep cleans of the existing shelters.
 - To undertake any minor repairs (replacement panels) or removal of graffiti that has been reported to the clerk.
 - Vegetation will be cleared when required.
 - Damaged shelters will normally be repaired to the original design.

4) Provisions of replacement shelters

- a) The provision of a replacement shelter will be considered by full council and be subject to the following:
 - If sufficient funds are available in the budget or grant funding can be obtained.
 - For 3 quotes to be obtained that are of a similar type that matches the existing shelter/and would be most suitable for the area or location.
 - If a replacement is refused it may not be reconsidered for a 12 month period from the date of the original decision.
 - If a replacement is not able to take place due to insufficient funds it can be reconsidered in the next financial year and will be addressed based on a "first-fail, first-served" system.
